meet millie jacobson a delightful caring child growing up in a metropolitan city with her mother father and twin brother tj the jacobsons have family values that are not uncommon to those times love respect and trust are critical to their family unit this story is a focus on that love millie and tj get their first independent library cards today the joy of knowing you can borrow books on your own merit is a goal for many of the children in their neighborhood but much more so for millie and tj in the excitement of traveling through the fantasies of each book millie loses her library card she overcomes the embarrassment through the love and friendship displayed by tj you will enjoy meeting millie and tj as much as i enjoy presenting them

the haunted library card short summary the haunted library card on maple street stands a library with two doors a bright glass door that welcomes bustle and a quiet wooden door that shuts with a friendly thump promising to keep secrets safe inside the air smells of dust pencil shavings and bake sale chocolate that mysteriously appears beside the best chapters shelves wear neat labels paper bats ride invisible breezes and mr page the calm keeper of keys watches from a well worn desk that has stamped countless books and steadied countless hearts each halloween at midnight a silk black library card wakes up silver numbers glimmer along their edge as they check out books by themselves with a
